

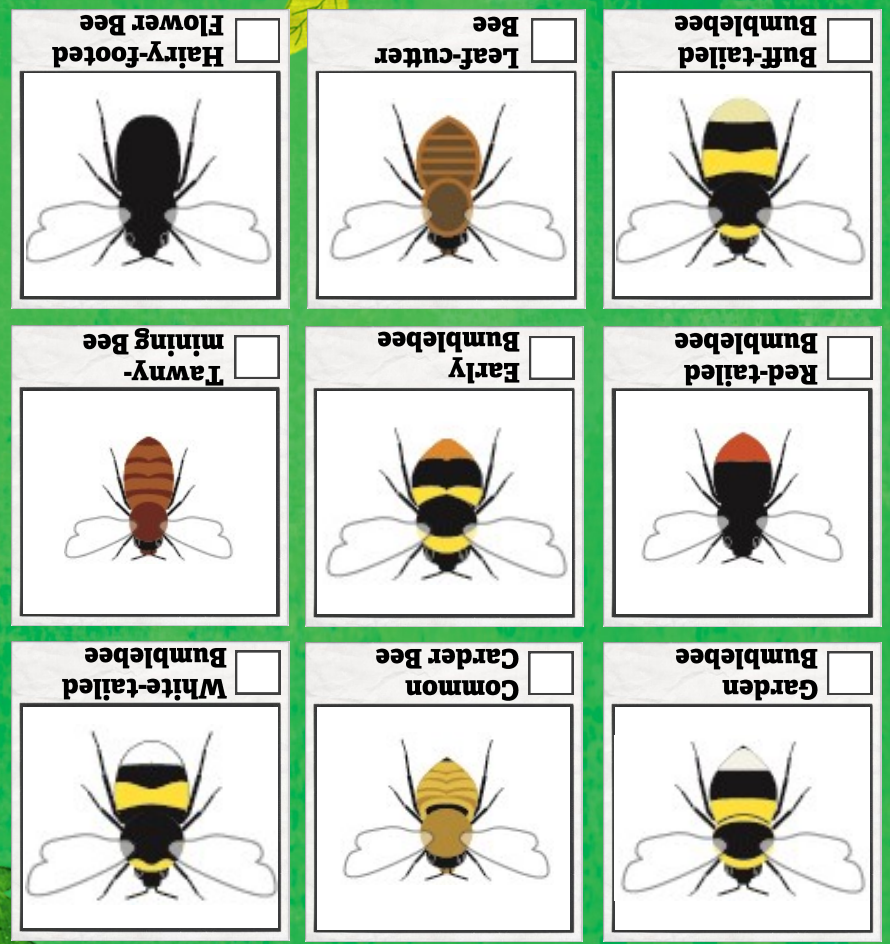
Not sure what species you've spotted? Send us your picture and we'll help you identify it!

Bumblebee Detective

Challenge your friends with these bumblebee facts!

Q: How many species of bumblebee are there in the UK?
A: 25

Q: Why do bumblebees buzz?
A: Although most think it's caused by their tiny wings flapping, the buzz is actually the sound of their muscles vibrating!

Q: How long is a bumblebee's tongue?
A: Some bumblebees have really long tongues - up to 20mm in length!

Q: Did you know...
Bumblebees have smelly feet! They leave a smelly trail (pheromone) on flowers that they have visited to let other bumblebees know it will be low on nectar or pollen.

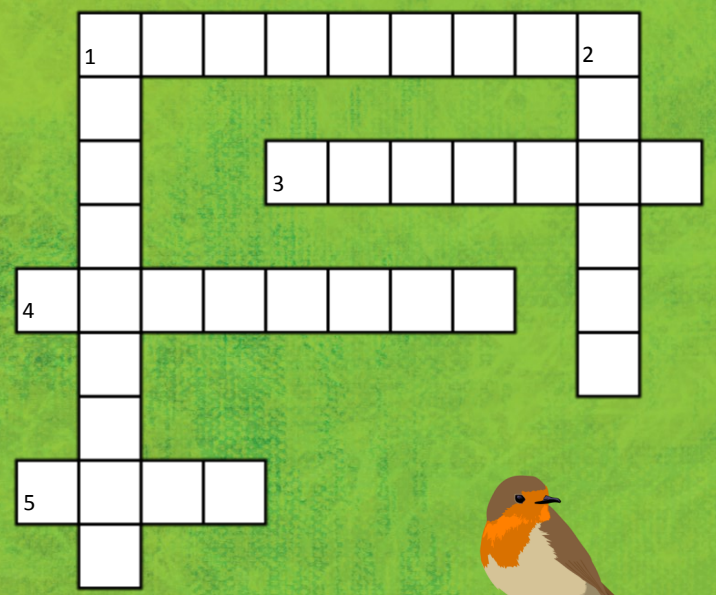
Can you match all the animals with their collective nouns? (Answers at the bottom!)
