GENERAL ROUTE DESCRIPTION

The wood is owned and managed by the Forestry Commission. It is a working woodland so please follow on site signs when forestry operations are in progress.

There is a circular easy access route through the wood (Larch walk) which is approximately 1.25 km (0.75 mile) in length. The paths are hard surfaced but bumpy in places with some loose stones. The route is either level or gently sloping.

This variety of trees and habitats makes it a great place to spot wildlife, including fallow and muntjac deer.






