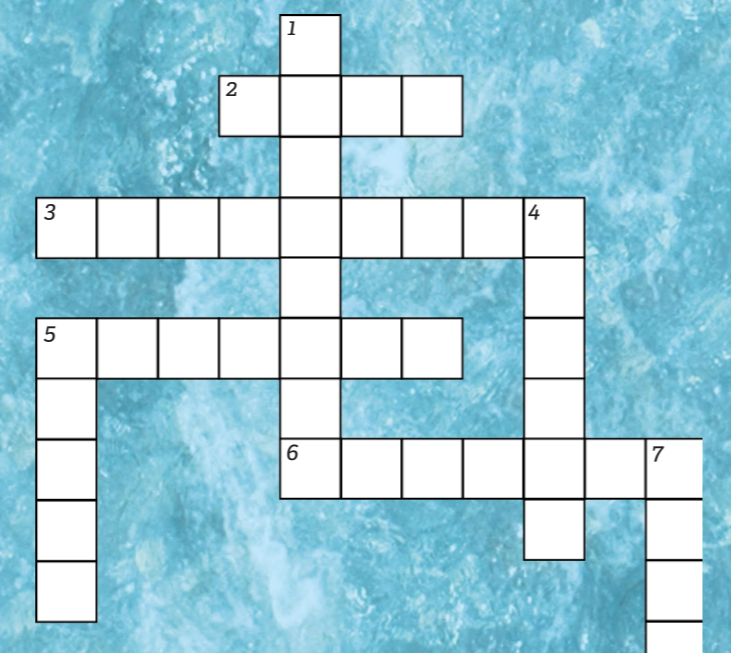



Did you know...
 If you spot a mermaid's purse, chances are, you've found a SHARK! Yep, these leathery pouches are actually the egg cases of sharks and rays.

Did you know...
 Whelk egg cases are made by the largest sea snail in UK seas. It lays its eggs in a spongy mass of up to 2000 egg capsules!

Did you know...
 The air filled pockets are what gives the bladder wrack its name, allowing this seaweed to float upright underwater.

Did you know...
 A sea potato is a type of sea urchin. It's empty shell is called a 'test'.

Did you know...
 Hornwrack isn't a seaweed, it's actually a colony of thousands of tiny animals known as zooids! Look closely and you can see the tiny holes they would have lived in.
