2020 YOUNG ENVIRONMENTALIST

About the Award

The Lincolnshire Young Environmentalist Award recognises the enthusiasm, hard work and commitment of young people. The Awards aim to foster a sense of responsibility for the environment and reward schools, groups, clubs and individuals for the fantastic achievements that are being made.

Entries are welcome from schools, youth groups such as scouts and guides, and individuals (nominations also welcome). The winner will receive a cash prize of £300. All schools making it through to the finals will receive a cash prize of £150. The six finalists of the Young Environmentalist Award will be invited to a full day of events at Whisby Nature Park on 21st May 2020.

Judging

The written entries will be assessed by a panel of judges which includes experts from around the county. Shortlisted entrants may be visited by a judge for a short discussion and tour as appropriate. Finalists will be invited to give a short, ten minute presentation to a judging panel at the Education Centre, Whisby Nature Park, Lincoln on the morning of the 21st May. Judging will start immediately and the awards and trophies will be presented. Full details will be forwarded to the finalists on completion of the initial judging. Following the presentation of awards, the Whisby Education Officer will lead a fun outdoor nature activity for all entrants.

Conditions of entry

- For the initial stage of the competition entries should be a single page of 250-300 words and no additional documentation or material should be included. An entry form is provided on our website.
- Entrants reaching the final stage may use whatever aids they wish to make the presentation.
- To be eligible for the Young Environmentalist Award entrants must be aged under 13 years old.
- The Young Environmentalist Award are not open to anyone connected to the sponsors or organisers.
- Deadline for entry is 31 March 2020.
- In all matters relating to the awards, the decision of the judges is final.
