Family Features

A family recognised for its compound umbels.

- Alternate leaves often sheathing the stem at their base
- Five separate petals. These can be either regular or irregular
- Reduced sepals
- Five stamens
- Two stigmas
- Inferior ovary
- Two carpels
- Mostly pinnate leaves often by several times


Fruit

The fruit is made from two sections called mericarps.
These separate from each other along a central axis at maturity. Each mericarp contains a single seed.

Leaf structure

Many members of the Apiaceae family have pinnate leaves. This is where the leaf structure is divided to a central axis or lateral rib.
